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I. Easter 2021: The Context

The mood of the nation

As we prepare for Easter 2021, it is important to recognise that we are in a very different place to where we were last year. On the 12th April 2020, we had been locked down for less than a month. This year, we will celebrate Easter, just over a year since the residents of the UK were told they 'must' stay at home.

During that year we have worked, worshipped, home-schooled, celebrated, mourned, and been forced to continually innovate. And most of the time we have done that alone. It is not surprising that everyone is exhausted, including our church leaders.

Easter also falls at the cusp of change - both just before and just after Easter, if the lockdown roadmap remains in place, some of our freedoms will be returned. There is hope.

Yet it is a frail and uncertain hope compared to the true hope that we have to proclaim because of Easter. A hope that sustains us through life and death. So the question remains - how can we celebrate that hope this year?

The rules and restrictions

Obviously, the rules and restrictions will differ depending on where in the UK you are based.

As we write, neither Wales nor Northern Ireland have announced their plans.

The Scottish Assembly has announced that up to four people from 2 households can meet outside and that churches will be able to open from the 26th March for up to 50 people.

In England, the following guidelines are likely to be in place:

- Churches can open, but many will still be online
- Outdoor services will be possible in church grounds
- No communal singing
- Parent and child groups of up to 15 over 5s can meet outside
- Groups of 6 or 2 households can meet outside



What follows are 106 ideas to bring hope

... to our Communities: those who live in our areas but may have little idea why Christians celebrate Easter

... to our Connections: our non-Christian family and friends; those who in normal times we would be working with, socialising with, playing sport with, chatting to at the school gate etc.

... to our Church Families: to bring the truths of the Easter story into our homes this Easter.

... through our Church Services: whether outdoors, indoors or online let's celebrate the hope of Easter in a way that is faithful and engaging?

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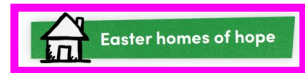

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2. Bringing hope to our Communities Signs of Hope

Signs of Hope - using our homes



There are many simple ways that we can encourage our church members to proclaim to the world that they are celebrating Easter with more than a Dairy Milk egg.

We can place an Easter garden on our doorstep or a wreath on our door or decorate our windows with easter images. The Easter Means Hope website from last year is still running so people can download the rainbow image and place in a prominent place. <https://eastermeanshope.com/>

Signs of Hope - in the churchyard or community



If your church yard is somewhere that people walk through, or sit for a cup of coffee on a bench, then why not give them something to look at?

A chalk walk of the Easter story? A changing tableau? Stones painted with Easter images for children to find?

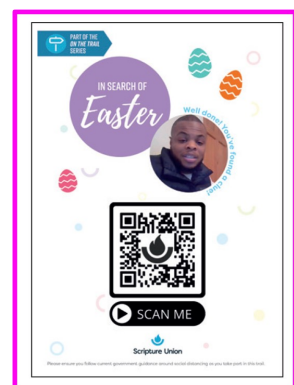

If you have a bunch of budding actors, and enough outside space for families to remain socially distanced, you could even organise a real - life story trail for your community. <https://easterstorytrail.org.uk/experience/>

And as with any of these ideas, finding ways to connect those who engage with your signs of hope with the church family are vital.



Why not have a prize for the most enthusiastic family? Or youngest /oldest person to engage with the trail - ask families to take photos of themselves doing the activities - and ask them to send them to the church email address? Prizes to be given out at the Easter Day service.

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3. Bringing hope to our Connections Gifts of Grace

Doorstep Deliveries



What could you leave on your neighbours' doorsteps? A bunch of daffodils? A bowl of easter eggs? Some home made easter cake? A simple painted stone?

It could be a secret as to who has left them - get people talking. Or leave with a note / invitation to Easter services.

You have been Egged



This is a popular idea in the US - but it might need tweaking to use in the UK - not sure how keen our neighbours would be to think we had been hiding things in their front garden.

But whether you use real eggs or chocolate ones just make sure one is empty (blown or hollow) to represent the empty tomb and leave your own version of the "You have been Egged" card.

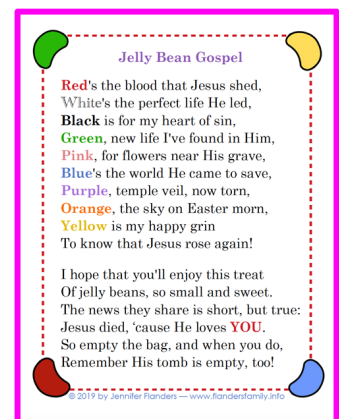

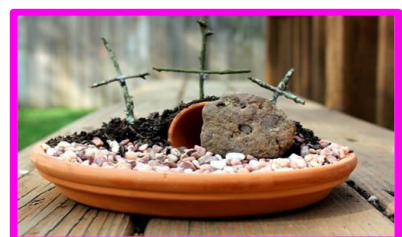

There is something for everyone:

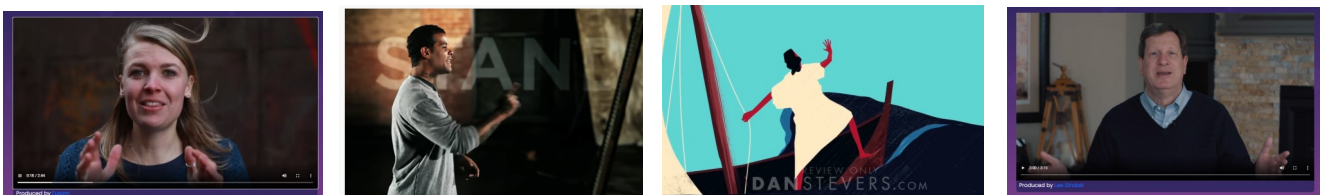
For example, these animations from the Australian Bible Society

Using Holy Week

With Easter falling in the middle of the Easter Holidays for most children it might give time for families to take time to explore the last week of Jesus' life together. Both the Resurrection Eggs idea and the Holy Week Box use objects as a springboard for telling the story.

More creative types might want to build the story out of Lego or younger ones may enjoy building the story one day at a time from Palm Day to Promised Day (via Pigeon Day and Perfume day) complete with actions!

Or you can go back to the jelly beans or emojis described before.



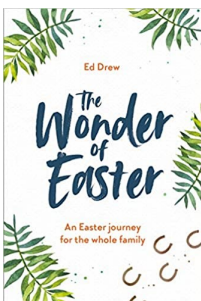

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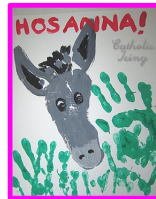


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7. Bringing hope to our Church Family: Things for kids to do

BBQ Time

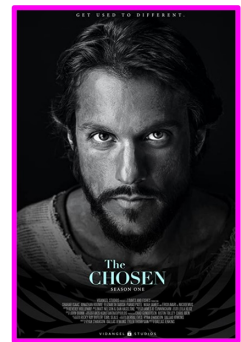

For a small cost, you could set up a Watch Party and enjoy Joseph Fiennes' film, Risen - a detective story based on the Easter story or start watching Chosen.

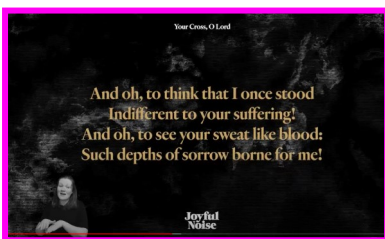
For added fun - you could set up a quiz as to which events are in the bible and which aren't!

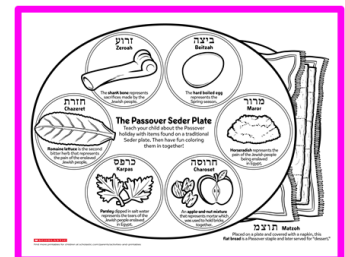

4. We all like sheep have gone astray. I know that to be true of me in my own experience. I observe it to be true of everyone else I know. And I hear it to be true in the admissions of others. Oh, we may dress it up as self-realisation, or excuse it or justify it. We may say "I have no regrets" or "I did it my way" but, even by our own standards, let alone the standards of a perfect God, we have all gone astray. And the consequence is hurt and pain and guilt which cheapens the infinite worth and despoils the infinite dignity

The Bible Society videos based on Peter’s experience of Easter are incredibly powerful and would fit well in a more meditative service.

easter was told through the introduction to and comments on the songs and hymns sung. Get in touch if you are interested.

Easter Sunday

It may not be possible to join together for a sunrise service this year - but why not encourage your church family to have their own time of reflection at sunrise - and ask people to take photos out of their window/ wherever they are of the sunrise. These could be sent to one person who could then create a photo montage in time for the main Easter Sunday service.

If Easter Sunday is an All-Age service here are a couple of ideas— complete with scripts.
